Credible Sources	<p><b>The committee discussed the number of credible sources that should be included in a literature review.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How many will we require? Is there a magic number of sources?</li> <li>• Do they need to show that they have conducted exhaustive research? What is exhaustive? Should they keep reading until sources start referencing each other or a common work?</li> <li>• What is credible?</li> <li>• The instructions refer to a credible number of studies. This is different than a credible number of citations.</li> <li>• Every outcome on their logic model should have a citation.</li> <li>• Many organizations are looking for information to support what they are already doing, not to find research to inform the development of their program.</li> <li>• The language on our score sheet and instructions under <i>Literature Review</i> should be changed to read <i>ALL criteria must be included</i>.</li> <li>• What if a Tier 2 or 3 is testing/evaluating new ideas, there may not be literature to back up their claims until their evaluation is complete.</li> </ul> <p><b>The literature review should include a sufficient number of credible studies that support claims made in the logic model.</b></p>	None	<p>Staff will change the wording on the instructions and score sheets, and post at <a href="http://www.SonomaUpstream.org">www.SonomaUpstream.org</a></p>
Evaluating and Evaluation	<p><b>Carlos, Katie and B.J. led a discussion on how to evaluate and evaluation.</b></p> <p><b>Research questions:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Research questions should drive evaluation and set up data.</li> <li>• The questions are the organizing principles.</li> <li>• There should be coherency between questions, data and the logic model.</li> </ul> <p><b>Data gathering methods:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There must be coherency.</li> </ul>	None

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is a need to watch for introduced biases.</li> <li>• Methods should make sense for the problem/questions and be achievable.</li> <li>• Is what they proposed to do backed up by what they actually did?</li> <li>• Two of the most consistent problems are missing someone or using the wrong tools.</li> <li>• Data must be collected at two points in time.</li> </ul> <p><b>Analysis</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Differential analysis talks about the data. Inferential analysis makes claims, including statistical testing, about the data. Inferential is less black and white and more grey.</li> <li>• What if your claim is that things didn't get worse? The status quo is maintained? Can that be a positive outcome?</li> <li>• Self report is acceptable for many of our purposes.</li> <li>• Do we push the rigor for renewals?</li> </ul>		Staff will include a discussion on increased rigor for renewals to a future agenda.
